<u>BajoTeja</u>

<u>A Casa Vella</u>

A Casa Vella, located in the village of Amiadoso, Galicia, is conceived as a space for artistic creation with a strong social vocation, of mediation and dynamisation of the rural context, with attention to the maintenance and enhancement of its endogenous resources and its intangible cultural heritage. Its activities are aimed at different groups: residents of Amiadoso and other rural areas, the artistic community, researchers and cultural and rural development managers. <u>Cancha Libre</u>

Cancha Libre is an open group of young people, which since 2020 has been working in Sala Rekalde in Bilbao with the accompaniment of the facilitator Inés García. The group proposes its own ways of approaching and understanding the artistic and cultural playing field of the territory. Cancha Libre, in contrast to the idea of the exhibition as utopia, claims the exhibition space as a place of (dis) encounters, connections, free experimentation and play.

Artist whose playground is the Internet and in which he has specialised in creating absurd comedy music videos. He is the author of one of the most influential music videos of the last 10 years in Spain, "Velaske, yo soi guapa". He uses his Instagram and Tiktok to share his experiments. Interested in the viral and the social effects of culture, his overflowing imagination and seemingly carefree pose make people laugh, but also make them think. He has produced content for platforms such as Playground and advertising for Netflix, Prime Video and Samsung.

Concomitentes

Concomitentes promotes the creation of artworks and mediates between the civil society that commissions them and the artists who produce them. Its practice is based on the methodology developed in 1990 by the artist François Hers, which in the last 25 years has had an enormous social and cultural impact, with more than 500 projects in Europe. At the same time, it organises public activities to deepen the art - participation - sustainability axes. Together with ZEMOS98, it coordinates In Between. <u>hablarenarte</u>

Non-profit organisation based in Madrid that has been working since 2002 in the field of cultural mediation, expanded curating and contemporary creation. With a changing structure, it is an ecosystem of interdependent and sustainable cultural projects that is committed to research and immaterial production. The question that underlies its practice is how to generate structures that facilitate different ways of making in order to link from and beyond the artistic field. It is under these premises that Planta Alta, a space for research residencies and encounters in Madrid, was born.

He is a consultant for the Calouste Gulbenkian and BPI/La Caixa Foundations.





Ministry of Space

The Ministry of Space aims to contribute to the democratic and just development of cities. It works actively with the community, supporting local initiatives to contribute to socio-political change in line with the principles of social justice. **Iva Čukić**, co-founded and today leads this collective. A graduate of the Faculty of Architecture in Belgrade, she holds a PhD in urbanism and her research focuses on urban commons and urban transformation from both academic and practical perspectives.

Ormston House

A meeting place for the arts in Limerick. Their programme is co-designed with artists and citizens, resulting in community partnerships, multi-annual projects and cultural events that are responsive to the city and its context. They have developed a participatory model to connect curatorial practice with local knowledge and activism. Their purpose is to provide expertise and resources for artists and communities to connect and to co-create excellent cultural experiences with curiosity and confidence. **Caimin Walsh** is curator at Ormston House, where he programmes exhibitions, events and multi-annual research projects.



MAR Platform

A platform promoted by the Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofía, the Daniel and Nina Carasso Foundation and hablarenarte that promotes change in the modes of production and collective participation of culture, understanding cultural mediation as the axis of these transformations. The platform generates plural meeting spaces where the great diversity of agents in the cultural mediation ecosystem can research, share and work, through a programme of research residencies (Notar), a cultural mediation network (Alzar) and a digital archive (Caja).



PLANEA, art & school network

It is a network of educational centres, cultural institutions and agents that use artistic practices in public schools in a transversal and situated way. The network gives special relevance to mediation as a way of expanding and establishing itself in the territories. Promoted by the Daniel and Nina Carasso Foundation, it is articulated through mediation in three territories: Invisible Pedagogies (Community of Madrid), PERMEA and the Consortium of Museums (Valencia) and ZEMOS98 (Andalusia).

ZEMOS98

ZEMOS98 is a 25-year-old organisation that develops mediation processes between activists, artists, academics, foundations and public institutions. Its aim is to highlight political and cultural processes for social change.
